MISSING PERSON JAY ANTHONY BROGDEN

\$250,000 REWARD

<u>REWARD</u>: The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services and Minister for Corrective Services has approved a reward of \$250,000 be offered for information which leads to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the disappearance of Jay Anthony Brogden, 21 years, last seen at Airlie Beach on 21 April 2007.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In the case of an offence being identified, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$250 000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of the Police Service.

<u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>: Jay Anthony Brogden was reported missing in the Whitsunday Police Division on 2 May 2007. The last confirmed sighting of the missing person was 21 April 2007 at Cannonvale.

The missing person had been involved in an argument with his girlfriend earlier in the evening.

All inquiries to date have failed to locate Brogden or determine the exact circumstances behind his disappearance. Investigating Police consider that Brogden may have met with foul play.
