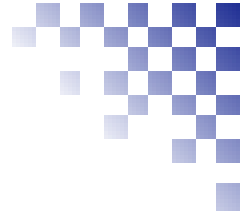

MURDER OF JUNE FLORENCE LILLIAN QUINTON

\$250,000 REWARD

REWARD: The Minister for Police and Corrective Services has approved a reward of \$250 000 be offered for information which leads to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the murder of June Florence Lillian QUINTON.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In addition, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$250 000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner.

CIRCUMSTANCES: At 12.30pm on Tuesday, 30 January 1996, the badly decomposed body of June Florence Lillian QUINTON was located on a vacant block of land situated in Bouquet Street, West End. There was no identification or other personal effects located with the deceased. Positive identification was made by fingerprint examination. A post mortem conducted on 30 January 1996 established the cause of death as being a blow to the right side of the head producing a 5cm x 5 cm fracture of the skull. The last reported sighting of the deceased was around 1200 hours on 25 January 1996 in the Fortitude Valley area. At that time she was in the company of a male friend.
