**Report: Firearms confiscated by/handed into QPS for destruction as at 10 September 2017**

As at 10/09/2017 the total number of firearms confiscated by/handed into QPS for destruction is 77,445.

- 4. These figures for the number of firearms includes those registered to the Queensland Police Service and other Queensland Government Departments.*
- 5. The data does not include information about weapons held by the Australian Defence Forces.*
- 6. These figures include CWR registered firearms only, they do not include major weapon components, Firearm Parts, Firearm Accessories or anything other than a rifle, shotgun or handgun.*
