The subject officer has failed to return his service issued firearm to the Gladstone Station armoury at the conclusion of this last shift, which was an 8am to 4pm shift, on the 6th of September 2016. The subject officer has left his loaded firearm in the holster on his utility belt which was locked in his cupboard in the Gladstone CPIU office. The subject officer has then commenced rec leave and days off, returning to duty at 14:00hrs on the 13th of September 2016.

Whilst working a 6pm to 2am shift on the 10th of September 2016 I conducted an audit of the gun safes at the Gladstone Police Station for the firearms of members of the Gladstone CPIU. I discovered that the assigned peg (30) for the firearm of the subject officer was empty. As the subject officer was on recreation leave/days off I accessed his locked cupboard within the Gladstone CPIU office and located his service issued firearm, loaded and still in its holster. I have taken his firearm to the armoury where I unloaded it and returned to the assigned peg and have double pad locked the firearm. Upon the subject officer's return to work I have informed him of what I had discovered and instructed him that he was required to be assessed by a qualified OST intstructor on his ability to comply with the loading and unloading procedures of his firearm and that he will also be required to complete a number of On Line Learning Products (a list has been prepared by the Gladstone ETO). FULL PRECIS

The SM was in the process of returning to the Gold Coast District (via QRAIL) after being deployed to the G20 event. He was in possession of a carry bag containing two Service issued firearms, one issued to himself and another officer He boarded the train and inadvertently forgot to carry on the bag containing the firearms. The train departed and a QRAIL employee located the bag on the platform, inspected same, identified it belonged to a QPS member then contacted the QPS. At this time the SM realised he did not have possession of the bag. He notified management of the loss during transit. The SM accepts full responsibility however to mitigate his actions he stated he had performed 10 x shifts straight at the G20 event, some of which were 12hrs long and he had struggled to sleep each day. By the last day he was completely fatigued. He took a phone call at the train station during which the train arrived and he boarded, forgetting to collect all of his bags. The SM confirmed he was familiar with the G20 exit instructions provided with respect to firearm security during return travel. The SM has been provided MG in relationn to this BOD by failing to comply with OPM 14.6.1
