The below information is derived from data extracted from the QPS Incident/Injury Notification and Reporting System (IINRS). This data includes incident data input into IINRS by QPS employees and WorkCover data downloaded daily from WorkCover Online.

Statistics between the 01.2013 - 01.2017 regarding;

 How many workers' compensation claims were received regarding alleged workplace bullying or negative workplace behaviours, whether proven or not, regardless of whether the claims were accepted by Workcover or not.

- In creating table 1, data from the IINRS system was extracted and filtered for WorkCover claims lodged by QPS employees as provided by the WorkCover data downloaded into the IINRS.
- Then the data was filtered by "Original Intimation Date" as recorded in the downloaded WorkCover data claims outside the specified dates were removed;
- Then the data was filtered by Psychological injury as recorded by the downloaded WorkCover data to provide the data in table 1;
- "Psychological injury" filtered data was then filtered by Mechanism of Injury as recorded as part of the Injury Classification in the IINRS.
- It should be noted that data downloaded from WorkCover into the IINRS does not include Mechanism of Injury, so the Mechanism of Injury as recorded by the QPS has been used.
- The specific mechanism of Injury (Workplace harassment and/or bullying by colleagues) was used to provide the data in table 1.
- 2. How many officers who have lodged psychological injury claims during the stated period were successfully rehabilitated either as an officer or a civilian.

Successful rehabilitation has been determined where the officer is not Medically Retired as a result of their Psychological Injury for which they have lodged a WorkCover claim. Career transitioned is where a Police Officer has transitioned into a Civilian Role.

• In creating table 2, data from the IINRS system was extracted and filtered for WorkCover claims lodged by Police Officers as provided by the WorkCover data downloaded into the IINRS.

- Then the data was filtered by "Original Intimation Date" as recorded in the downloaded WorkCover data claims outside the specified dates were removed;
- Then the data was filtered by Psychological injury as recorded by the downloaded WorkCover data to provide the data in column 2;
- Then the data for psychological claims lodged was forwarded to HR to determine:
 - Which employees on the list have been medically retired with date of medical retirement
 - Which employees on the list have been career transitioned to a civilian role with date of transition to civilian role.
- HR returned the data with the requested information.
- Each Medical Retirement record from the data was manually checked to identify if the record had a corresponding Medical retirement record in Case Management for the specific injury subject to the WorkCover Claim.
