SUSPECTED MURDER OF Vincent Raymond ALLEN



\$250 000 REWARD

REWARD: The Minister for Police and Minister for Corrective Services has approved a reward of \$250 000 to be offered for information which leads to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the suspected murder of Vincent Raymond ALLEN on or about 18 April 1964 at Warwick.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In addition, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$250,000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of the Queensland Police Service.

CIRCUMSTANCES: The Queensland Police Service has recommenced an investigation into the suspected homicide of Vincent Raymond ALLEN in the Warwick area in 1964. ALLEN was employed as a labourer with Queensland Rail near Warwick, and had previously worked on the construction of the Leslie Dam in Warwick. He was last sighted in Warwick on 18 April 1964. Investigating Detectives are appealing for public assistance to confirm the movements of Vincent Raymond ALLEN around this time.
