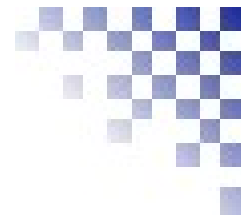

SUSPECTED MURDER OF GREGORY JAMES THURLOW ON OR ABOUT 1 OCTOBER 1996

\$500,000 REWARD

REWARD: The Minister of Police and Corrective Services has approved a reward of \$500,000 offered for information leading to the identification and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the suspicious disappearance and suspected murder of Gregory James Thurlow, 27 years, at Bray Park on or about 1 October 1996.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In the case of an offence being identified, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$500,000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of the Police Service.

CIRCUMSTANCES: On or about 1 October 1996 Gregory James Thurlow was last seen leaving an address in Mitze Street, Bray Park. Thurlow left this address with a male associate in a green Holden Commodore sedan and has not been seen since. It is believed the vehicle travelled along Anzac Avenue, Mango Hill.

Thurlow was not reported as a missing person until a family member contacted police on 5 August 1998. Family members believe Thurlow was murdered. Thurlow's disappearance and suspected murder remains unsolved.
