CHRISTINE MARIA FENNER 12 FEBRUARY 1999

\$500,000 REWARD

REWARD: The Minister for Police and Corrective Services and Minister for Fire and Emergency Services has approved a reward of \$500,000 offered for information leading to the identification and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the suspected murder of Christine Marie Fenner, 47 years, at Booyal on 12 February 1999.

INDEMNITY FROM PROSECUTION: In the case of an offence being identified, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution will be recommended for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

The allocation of the \$500,000 reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of the Queensland Police Service.

<u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>: Christine Maria Fenner, 47 years of age, resided in a caravan at a rural property at 532 Kirk Marule Road Booyal with her defacto partner. Christine was last seen at her home at 11.00am on 12 February 1999 by a visiting friend. At around 5.30pm on 12 February 1999, Christine's defacto partner returned home and found that she was not at the caravan or on the property. Christine's daughter discovered her mother was missing on 17 February 1999 and subsequently contacted Police, reporting her as missing person. To date, no further contact has been received from Christine Fenner and her remains have not been located.
