DESCRIPTION OF EVENT - Argos involvement in US victim identification taskforce

## **CURRENT SITUATION / ACTIONS**

- The Homeland Security Investigation (HSI) Victim Identification Task Force (VIDTF), called Renewed Hope, took place from July 17 to August 4, 2023, at the Cyber Crime Centre (C3) in Fairfax, Virginia. It is a multi-national initiative, originally proposed at the 2023 Interpol Specialist group on Crime Against Children by Argos to review selected unsolved cases of unidentified victims within Interpol's International Child Sexual Exploitation (ICSE) database.
- The taskforce involved US authorities and representatives from Interpol, Europol, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Colombia, Ecuador, Estonia, France, Germany, Ireland, Spain and the United Kingdom.
- The operation was the first of its kind to be led in the United States and today the HSI has issued a formal media release (link below).

- Acting PO6 CTPI of the Argos Victim Identification Team attended to represent Australia along with a member of the AFP Victim Identification Team. His overseas travel was approved by the Minister in June 2023.
- During the taskforce the HSI utilised facial recognition technology called 'Clearview ID' which has recently been found by the Australian Information Commissioner to have breached the Privacy Act in relation to its collection of

images from Australian servers for use in its facial recognition technology.


- The QPS and AFP members did not utilise or have any access to Clearview ID during the taskforce. Their role was to review material and identify leads through other open source investigative methods.
- The taskforce resulted in the generation of 311 probable identifications of previously unknown victims, including 14 positive contacts and several confirmed victim rescues from active abuse

## MEDIA ISSUES

- The QPS has been contacted for an interview about the QPS involvement, including the role of Argos in organising the Taskforce.
- No mention will be made during any media interview of Clearview ID by the QPS, however the issue of facial recognition technology will probably be raised. Police Media are assisting with appropriate messaging around this technology to ensure any comments are brand agnostic and that mention is made of the potential privacy and human rights implications that the technology can bring.

## SUBJECT: OVERSEAS TRAVEL APPROVAL - A06 CTPI, CHILD ABUSE AND SEXUAL CRIME GROUP (CASCG), TO TRAVEL TO VIRGINIA, USA TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATION VICTIM IDENTIFICATION TASK FORCE - 22 JULY 2023 TO 6 AUGUST 2023

#### PURPOSE:

 To seek Minister's approval for AO6 CTPI (CASCG) to travel to Virginia USA to participate in the Homeland Security Investigation (HSI) Victim Identification Task Force (VIDTF) from 22 July 2023 to 6 August 2023.

### BACKGROUND:

- 2. The HSI VIDTF, called Renewed Hope, is a multi-national initiative, originally proposed at the 2023 Interpol Specialist Group on Crime Against Children to review selected unsolved cases of unidentified victims within Interpol's International Child Sexual Exploitation (ICSE) database. The aim of the VIDTF is to ensure that international experts can work together to identify as many of the child victims as possible implementing current technology and capability that may not have been available at the time the material was discovered.
- 3. The ICSE image and video database is an intelligence and investigative tool, which allows victim identification investigators from more than 68 countries to consolidate and share data on cases of child sexual abuse that are found across the world.
- 4. This is the first task force with the aim of looking at older unsolved cases using new and emerging technologies. Previous task force iterations, run by Europol and Interpol have resulted in the identification of new, previously unseen child victims and the ongoing international collaboration following the events has resulted in the identification of many more child victims and the arrest of their abusers.
- 5. AO6 CTPI works in the victim identification team of Argos contributing to investigative efforts around the world to identify victims and offenders of child exploitation. His investigative and forensic skill set contribute significantly to the efficiency and effectiveness of global law enforcement efforts to fight online child exploitation. CTPI was recruited by Queensland Police Service (QPS) to the post of Victim Identification Analyst, with additional government funding. His role involves reviewing selzed child exploitation material for clues to help locate and identify children being abused. Since his appointment in February 2017 the Victim Identification Team in Argos has been involved in the identification of over 1,400 children in this way.
- QPS continues to be heavily involved in the analysis, investigation, and infiltration of the most prominent child abuse sites on the darknet. This activity has resulted in Argos assisting international partners in the identification of several high-profile offenders and child victims of sexual abuse.
- 7. The HSI VIDTF will take place from 17 July to 4 August 2023, at the Cyber Crime Centre in Fairfax, Virginia. The task force will bring together victim identification specialists, special agents, computer forensic analysts, criminal analysts, as well as partners from the FBI, NCMEC, INTERPOL, EUROPOL, and foreign law enforcement. Experts will be participating

at various times over the three-week task force. AO6 CTPI has been selected to participate from 25 July to 4 August 2023

- 8. Formed in 1998, ICMEC heads a global missing children's network of 29 countries. The organization has trained law enforcement personnel from 121 countries, works with law enforcement in over 100 countries, and has worked with legislatures in 100 countries to adopt new laws combating child sexual abuse material. ICMEC also encourages the creation of national operational centres built on a public-private partnership model and leads global financial and industry coalitions to eradicate child sexual exploitation and child abuse material.
- ICMEC, in cooperation with the not-for-profit Tim Tebow foundation, has received funds to provide resources allowing select international victim identification experts to attend the HSI VIDTF. AO6 CTPI has been chosen as one of six international experts to receive this funding by ICMEC.

#### ISSUES:

- 10. It is proposed that AO6 CTPI depart Australia on 22 July 2023 with a proposed return date to Brisbane of 6 August 2023.
- 11. All costs related to this travel, including airfares, accommodation, meals and allowances will be met by ICMEC. This advice was only provided to the QPS on 9 June 2023. Total costs are estimated to be \$7,100.00 (AUD). There are no additional costs required by the QPS.
- 12. Of particular benefit will be the opportunity for CTPI to maintain his links and reputation within the international law enforcement community and his awareness of best practice. He will also be exposed to emerging technologies and capabilities that could be utilized by QPS to enhance investigations of child sexual abuse. This international collaboration will help to maintain the reputation of Argos and the QPS at a global level.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**



We would welcome you to join the 2023 HSI Cyber Crimes Center (C3) Victim Identification Task Force (VIDTF) Renewed Hope. The VIDTF Renewed Hope is scheduled to start on July 17 and conclude August 4, 2023 and hosted in the United States at the Fairfax, Virginia location of HSI C3. The VIDTF will be comprised of HSI's Victim Identification Specialists, Special Agents, Computer Forensic Analysts, Criminal Analysts, as well as partners such as yourselves from the FBI, NCMEC, INTERPOL, EUROPOL, and foreign law enforcement members. The goal of the Task Force is to use this time to identify the maximum number of unknown victims residing in a selected data set provided to HSI by INTERPOL. Task Force Members will examine child sexual abuse images, videos and review intelligence relating to various unidentified Series to help identify victims and/or offenders or locations where abuse may be occurring. We hope that, with your assistance, we will identify and safeguard child victims from further abuse, and provide much needed intelligence to law enforcement agencies throughout the world to apprehend child predators.

This invitation is being distributed to many of you who have already participated in VIDTFs held by either EUROPOL or INTERPOL. HSI C3 hopes to replicate the methods, cooperation, and skills used in previous VIDTFs and help to put a dent in the ever-expanding unidentified victim dataset. Participating Task Force Members will have the opportunity to contact colleagues from other countries, exchange victim identification know-how, and improve international police cooperation.

Currently HSI C3, with the assistance of INTERPOL, is determining the victim ID data set to be used. It will not be a large data set, but a manageable one that draws from the ICSE database and will have been deconflicted with EUROPOL, HSI NCVIS, NCMEC, FBI, RCMP, CAID, and the ACCCE.

## General description of the operational workflow:

Victim ID Specialists will be provided images of unknown child victims and use forensic tools to attempt to identify the victim(s). Once an identification is made, HSI's team of criminal analysts will further triage the victim information and attempt to enhance the information with additional analytic product. Intelligence/lead packages will then be created by the identification specialists, which will include the victim media files as well as the other identifying information related to unidentified victims/offenders which may be useful to identify a victim and/or investigate and apprehend an offender.

For this operation, HSI C3 is looking forward to host and coordinate a total of twenty-four (24) Victim Identification Specialists from the U.S. and throughout the world.
