Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<p>The Proclamation fixes 3 June 2024 for the commencement of the remaining provisions of the <i>Emergency Services Reform Amendment Act 2024</i> (ESRA Act).</p> <p>The ESRA Act is a component of a suite of legislative reforms that will restructure Queensland’s emergency services and disaster management arrangements. These reforms will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • establish Marine Rescue Queensland (MRQ) as a state-wide marine rescue service through the <i>Marine Rescue Queensland Act 2024</i>; • establish the State Emergency Service (SES) through the <i>State Emergency Service Act 2024</i>; • align MRQ and SES under the control of the Queensland Police Service (QPS) through the ESRA Act; and • establish the State Disaster Management Group within the <i>Disaster Management Act 2003</i> through the ESRA Act. <p>The QPS has assessed the Proclamation as machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. The QPS has identified that no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
