Proposal type	Details
Minor and machinery in nature	<p>The Proclamation fixes 30 September 2024 for the commencement of the remaining provisions of the <i>Police Powers and Responsibilities and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2024</i> that are not in force.</p> <p>Part 3, Division 3 (sections 11 to 19) are the provisions that are not in force. These provisions promote the ongoing safe management of prisoners at risk of self-harm or suicide by allowing the chief executive to authorise practitioners with more diverse professional qualifications to make timely clinical assessments and recommendations about safety orders.</p> <p>The Proclamation is machinery in nature as it has the effect of commencing provisions not yet in force. No further regulatory impact analysis is required under the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>.</p>
